

## Oncology Position Announcement

Assistant, Associate or Professor of Veterinary Oncology. The Mississippi State University College of Veterinary Medicine has an immediate opening for a tenure track faculty position in Veterinary Oncology. Qualifications include DVM (or equivalent veterinary degree) and residency training in Oncology. Diplomate status in the American College of Veterinary Internal Medicine – Oncology is preferred, but individuals eligible for final certification examination will also be considered. An advanced degree and experience in clinical research are desirable. Teaching responsibilities involve didactic teaching and clinical training of professional students, interns, residents, and graduate students. Service responsibilities involve clinical case management, rotating emergency duty, and consultation with private practitioners. Participation in the college's continuing education and clinical research program is strongly encouraged, as is the development of specific area of clinical and research focus and expertise. External grant acquisition and supervision of postgraduate degree students is encouraged and supported, and initial funding is available to support the development of research initiatives. Salary is commensurate with qualifications and experience. Benefits package includes paid vacation, retirement, health insurance, and consulting options. Clinical resources available include a 3 Tesla MRI, a 64 slice CT unit enabling CT-guided biopsy, and a linear accelerator for radiotherapy.

Applications will be accepted until the position is filled. The College is currently also recruiting for a clinical track faculty position in Veterinary Oncology.

The College of Veterinary Medicine is located on the campus of Mississippi State University in scenic northeast Mississippi.
